

Field Day 2011 Events Schedule – June 25th and 26th

- June 25th
 - 8:30 AM - Start of setup operations
 - General Meeting
 - Delegation of responsibility and work groups
 - 1:00 PM – Test Equipment
 - 2:00 PM – Start of Field Day Communications
 - Begin Field Day operating in voice mode
 - 4:00 PM – Assess communication operation
 - Determine if one HF station should be converted to digital or CW operation
 - 6:30 PM – Passing Dish Supper
 - Bring your own table service and non-alcoholic beverages
 - Bring a passing dish
 - Meat (burgers and dogs) and buns provided by the club
 - June 25th (continued)
 - 8:00 PM – Resume full radio operations
 - Digital mode on one HF radio. CW operation is an option if CW operators are available
 - VHF/UHF station manned for local contacts
 - Local contacts will be logged for those hams that will not be operating a radio at the Field Day site. If you change your mind and operate (GOOD for you), your contact will be removed from the log.
 - Operator available from 8:00 until 9:30.
 - Contact must be made using **SIMPLEX** operation (146.88 MHz and 446.0 MHz)
 - Operations from 8 until 9:30
 - 10:00 PM – Generator refueling
 - Time is approximate but should occur while some sunlight is available
 - Midnight – Night Time operations begin
 - Night time operations coordinators take over
 - Reduced radio operations for supper
- Communication with the **Field Day site before the start of radio operation will be done using the repeater (146.88 MHz 100 PL)**. A radio operator will be on duty to respond to your call. After the start of radio operation, Field Day site communication for non-logging contacts will continue to use the repeater. An operator may not be available to respond immediately to your call. Have patients and try again in a few minutes.
